CHAPLAIN'S CORNER

John 17:20-26

Troops, in today's Gospel, Jesus prays for our unity with him and for us to be immersed in God's love: "I made known to them your name and I will make it known, that the love with which you loved me may be in them and I in them."

We are not simply supplicants or penitents, calling to God from without; we are sons and daughters, friends, calling to him from within. The Paschal Mystery is intelligible only in the light of the doctrine of the Trinity. God so loved the world that he sent his only Son, even to the limits of godforsakenness, even into sin and death, into the darkest corners of human experience, in order to find us.

But this acrobatic act of love is possible only if there is in the very being of God a sender and one that he can send, only if there is a Father and a Son. The language Jesus uses—"that they may be brought to perfection as one, that the world may know that you sent me, and that you loved them even as you loved me"—shows us that the Father and the Son are united in love, and this love is itself the divine life. Thus there is a Spirit, coequal to the Father and the Son.

Military Culture Competency

Learn the explicit culture that expands from military service. This basic course provides insight into the military, actions, and injuries associated with service members and their families. This is the first step in participation with the Military Veteran Peer Network. This is a discussion oriented course which lasts about 2 hours.

Mental Health First Aid - Veterans

Mental Health First Aid provides insight to common mental health issues within our community. It addresses symptoms as well as how to connect with individuals that are needing support. The Veteran's module focuses on military related mental health issues as well as building rapport with the military connected population. This is an 8-hour course.

AS+K

Suicide Prevention gatekeeper training. Understanding statistics, the state approach to suicide as well as the way to connect others to resources. This is an introductory class with resources.

CALM

Learn about securing access to lethal means and it's importance in suicide prevention. This is a clinical type of training, detailing field-like conversation and how to address them in the most effective way.




Mental Health After Deployment: What to Know and Where to Get Help

Returning home from deployment can be challenging in a variety of ways for service members. Not only will they be adjusting to a new routine, but they may also be wrestling with strong feelings of fear, sadness or helplessness from their experiences while deployed. While some combat and operational stress reactions are common and heal with time, others may require professional attention. By recognizing the warning signs and knowing how to get help, you and your service member can become more resilient in the face of reintegration challenges.



What to Expect: An Overview of Reunion and Reintegration

Deployment is coming to an end, and service members are finally heading home. Next comes the reunion and reintegration phase. There are five key stages within reunion and reintegration. Learn about the timeline and what you may expect during each stage.



<u>Creating a New Normal as a Family</u>

Even if your family has experienced deployment before, this time things may be different. Things may have changed, and it's okay if you're not able to go back to how things used to be, before the deployment. Focus on how you can make things comfortable and normal for the family.



Five Tips to Support Children During Reintegration

Returning home after deployment is exciting, but it can also be an adjustment for you and your loved ones. For children in particular, it may be emotional or confusing. To help your children with the transition, it's important to develop a plan that's personalized for their age, level of understanding and development stage.

Step one is the Introduction to Entrepreneurship course eligible to Veterans of all eras, service members (including members of the National Guard and Reserve) and their spouses. This course is instructed by SBA and its partners, Who are skilled business advisors.

Step two is one of the online follow-on courses instructed by a consortium of professors and skilled business advisors from the SBA Network. - Employment preparation courses

ELIGIBILITY

- Must be 16 years or older
- Must be willing to maintain constant communication with the Success Coach
- Must be willing to participate in all assigned trainings and classes
