CHAPLAIN'S CORNER

Luke 22:24 (NIV)

"A dispute also arose among them as to which of them was considered to be the greatest."

This moment occurs during the Last Supper, when the disciples were arguing about who among them was the greatest. Immediately after, Jesus teaches them a powerful lesson about humility and servanthood. He emphasizes that greatness in His kingdom is not defined by power or status but by how we serve others.

This verse has been on my mind over the last few days as we continue to evolve and adapt in our OLS formation to meet the mission's intent. Once again, the service members and families will rise to the challenge. That's who we are — we step up when called upon.

Some warning signs may help you determine if a battle buddy is at risk for suicide, especially if their behavior is new, has increased, or seems related to a painful event, loss, or change:

- Talking about wanting to die or to kill themselves
- Talking about feeling hopeless or having no reason to live
- Talking about feeling trapped or in unbearable pain
- Talking about being a burden to others
- Increasing the use of alcohol or drugs
- Acting anxious or agitated; behaving recklessly
- Sleeping too little or too much
- Withdrawing or isolating themselves
- Showing rage or talking about seeking revenge
- Extreme mood swings



We will never forget.


