Commander's Corner

Maintenance Professionals,

Over the past month, I did something that might surprise you...I went to mental health. Following my car wreck on 30 April, I experienced weeks of severe pain and sleepless nights. We never really know how a significant trauma will affect us mentally, whether in combat or in a vehicle. Initially, despite my situation, going to mental health did not occur to me. Instead, it took a friend's prompting. I was talking to another Lt Col in our wing and then he shared details of his own major car accident months before. He said, "You might want to give Ms. Lynn a call. You're dealing with a lot, and she had some great advice when I talked to her about my accident." So, I got in touch with Ms. Kathryn Lynn, our wing Mental Health Counselor, and she really did help.

A few lessons for us:

- 1) First, I went to mental health...and I am still the MXS/CC. If you didn't believe it before, I'm here to tell you it's a fact. My career wasn't affected at all, and the same is true for almost every other Airman who seeks mental health services.
- 2) Next, I didn't just go. A friend and wingman encouraged me to go. You are a friend and peer to MXSers I can't reach, even as the CC. Why? Because I'm not an E-4, an aircraft maintainer, a big mountain biker or (fill in the blank) like the person we need to reach, but you are. You have a circle of influence in this unit I don't have. By overlapping all of our circles, we create a great blanket of MXS resiliency.
- 3) Finally, if someone suggests you might benefit from visiting mental health or other support services, take the time to consider that recommendation seriously. We all have blind spots and sometimes others can see things we can't see.

The only true failure is NOT getting help when you need it. If you need to speak to a counselor for any reason, I strongly urge you to contact Ms. Lynn at 817-852-3597 or kathryn.a.lynn2.civ@mail.mil.

NEW INFORMATION ASSURANCE FORMS REQUIRED MANDATORY SUSPENSE IS SEPTEMBER 30, 2016

As a result of a Communications Flight (CF) audit, it has come to the Wing's attention that all users within the wing are required to have the newest revision of the DD Form 2875 and AF Form 4394 for Information System access.

Due to the evolving requirements with handling Personally Identifiable Information (PII), the CF is required to minimize the PII that is held on forms in their file plan. The depreciated versions of the network access paperwork contain fields that record Member's Social Security Numbers. We are required to replace these forms with the versions that utilize EDIPI (DoDID) numbers in lieu of SSNs.

Users that currently have old versions of the above forms with SSNs versus DoDID, are required to submit new DD Form 2875's and AF Form 4394's so that their old forms may be purged from the file plan. Once complete and signed electronically, submit to your Supervisor for signature and routing.

BOTTOM LINE: If Comm does not have both of your updated forms before September 30, your account will be deactivated.

ATTENTION RECENT DEPLOYERS

If you are completing a Post-Deployment Health Assessment, you need to complete the online questionnaire and contact the LHI Call Center at 1-855-544-4642 to finish the assessment. If you have DHA3 Appt, DHA4 Appt, or DHA5 Appt next to your name you have not contacted the Call Center. If you are a new deployer, you must complete the Pre-Deployment Health Assessment (DD 2795) before your Medical Appointment.
