

FAQ for University of Texas Project Management Professional Program at Camp Mabry

Who is eligible to take this course? Currently, this class is only for NG Soldiers who are using the Credentialing Assistance (CA) Program or those who would like to self-pay. Enlisted and Officers can participate but it is important to note that in order to qualify for the Project Management Professional (PMP) certification, you must meet certain project management requirements and have a certain number of hours of project management experience. If you don't meet the required amount of project management experience, you will be eligible to sit for the Certified Associate of Project Management (CAPM) certification exam which allows you to obtain the necessary project management experience hours to sit for the PMP exam. Additionally, officers who choose to participate will incur a concurrent military service obligation that starts at the end date of the course.

How much does it cost? The cost of the course is \$3995 and is covered under the credentialing assistance program. There are not out of pocket costs to the Soldier unless they have used Federal Tuition Assistance or CA for other courses in the same FY.

What is included? UT has created a unique and comprehensive program for the Texas Army National Guard that includes the following: Program consists of a fifty-six (56) hour training that includes classroom lecture, practical exercises, lesson handout study, class discussion, classroom quizzes, and online exam practice, and an exam voucher. Students will complete practice exams and quizzes online outside of class through PM FASTrack® Cloud – PMP® Exam Simulator which has been a great predictor of passing rates for the PMP exam. Instructors will also help prepare project management hours required to sit for the exam. See the chart below.

I'm leaving the Army and/or retiring soon. Can I still take this course? You can but you must make sure the end of the course is before your ETS for enlisted. For officers, using CA funds will require a military service obligation of 2 years for AGR and 4 years for M-day.

What do I need to bring to class? All Soldiers must bring with them a notepad and writing utensils.

Can I attend the class if I want to pay for the class myself? Yes.

What if I fail the training? If a Soldier fails the training, they will pay the Army back whatever funds were borrowed. Provisions are made for Soldiers who unexpectedly deploy. Communicating with the instructors and the program manager, Mary Lantz, is required in these circumstances.

What is the time commitment for this 7 week course? The course meets twice a week from 1700-2100 with a total of 56 in-classroom hours. It is recommended to spend the same amount of time (56 hours) out of class studying for the exam using the study aides provided to you throughout the course.

What are the contingencies for COVID 19? UT has created this course with the intention of having everyone in class but understands that it may be necessary to move to a distance learning environment. In this case, Microsoft teams or Cisco WebEx (TBD) will be used to complete all course objectives and requirements.
