Austin's Camp Mabry to hold force protection exercise

CAMP MABRY, Texas (March 17, 2014) – The Texas Military Forces, along with the Austin Police Department, will conduct a joint force protection training exercise at Camp Mabry, in Austin, Texas, from March 17-19, 2014.

With military readiness and safety being top priorities for the Texas National Guard leadership, this joint training exercise will test scenario driven policies and procedures in place, enhance security, and improve communication with our civilian partners.

Additionally, this exercise provides both the Texas National Guard and the Austin Police Department hands-on training that is necessary for emergency situations.

Again, this is an interagency training exercise and there are no immediate threats to Camp Mabry. During this time, the post will remain open to the public, however it is possible visitors will experience service delays.
