



Reporting Sexual Assault



What Every Texas Military Department Service Member Should Know
You are **NOT** alone

The Texas Military Department does not tolerate sexual assault in any form.

Consent is not given when a person uses force, threat of force, coercion, or when the Survivor is asleep, incapacitated or unconscious.

If you believe you have been sexually assaulted, we encourage you to take the following steps:
Get to a SAFE PLACE away from the perpetrator and call someone you trust.

Who are safe people?

- Your State SARC at **512-565-4410**
 - Rape Crisis Center
 - Police, EMS and/or friends or family
- DoD Safe Helpline at **1-877-995-5247** or **safehelpline.org**

- **Seek medical care as soon as possible. Even if you do not have any visible physical injuries, you may be at risk of becoming pregnant or acquiring a sexually transmitted infection:**
- **Ask the health care personnel to conduct a sexual assault forensic examination to preserve forensic evidence**
 - **If you suspect you have been drugged, request that a urine sample be collected**

For Emergencies:

Contact your local hospital or Rape Crisis Center and seek medical assistance.

Call 911 if you are in danger or need immediate medical assistance.
