CONSIDERATION: All applicants will receive consideration for this position without regard to race, religion, color, national origin, sex, age, political affiliation or other non-merit factors.

NOTE: IAW JCDTF SOP, vacancies will be offered to applicants based on their placement on the order of merit list (OML).

WHO MAY APPLY: Applications will be accepted from current Texas Military Department service members who meet the criteria listed in this announcement.

DUTIES AND RESPONSIBILITIES:

PRIMARY MISSION: On order, the Ground Reconnaissance conducts low visibility counterdrug reconnaissance/observation operations in Texas to detect, document, and report illegal drug activity in order to support law enforcement drug interdiction operations.

SECONDARY MISSION: On order, the Ground Reconnaissance provides training support to law enforcement agencies in military subjects and skills in order to support law enforcement drug interdiction operations.

1. Based on an approved mission request for National Guard support to law enforcement counterdrug operations, the Ground Reconnaissance provides initial mission planning and coordination, command and control, field operators, and support personnel anywhere in the state of Texas.
2. The Ground Reconnaissance can deploy a single operator, a small element, or the entire detachment in support of the approved request. For quick reaction missions, depending on

the availability of personnel and equipment, the Ground Reconnaissance can have an element en route within 2 hours of the request to anywhere in the state of Texas.

3. The Ground Reconnaissance provides photo surveillance, and video support and is able to establish its own short range, secure voice communications net that will interface with law enforcement nets.
4. The Ground Reconnaissance provides its own medical support and sustainment, with a limited capability to provide trauma management.
5. The Commander (CDR) is responsible for all personnel and activities of the Ground Reconnaissance. CDR is responsible for hiring, training and qualifying of all Ground Reconnaissance members, maintenance and proper use of all assigned equipment.
6. Coordinates as necessary with law enforcement agencies to determine their requirements and de-conflict mission execution.
7. Directs the completion of feasibility assessment of all missions, once the mission is tasked to the detachment.
8. Manages tasking of missions, and developing initial courses of action, methods of insertion, timeline, and logistical needs.
9. Assigns tasks, oversees the planning cell, responsible for the mission packets, briefs Counterdrug Commander on missions concept and team status, and assists the Counterdrug Commander on briefing to higher.
10. Assigns missions to the teams, attends brief backs and debriefs, as well as performs detachment AARs.
11. Must have basic knowledge of Army/Air Force logistical and administrative systems for staff cross training. CDR reports directly to the Counterdrug Commander (CDC).

REQUIRED POSITION QUALIFICATIONS:

1. Must be available for TDY assignments and travel as required
2. Must be a graduate or attend and successfully complete the Ground Reconnaissance Operator's Training Course. Failure to meet Ground Reconnaissance standards and requirements during this period will result in termination
3. Have at least three years' experience in JCDF and at least two years in JCDF- Ground Reconnaissance
4. Have at least five years' experience in a military leadership position supported by evaluation
5. Applicant must meet and maintain appropriate level physical/height/weight standards and pass the appropriate service fitness test IAW service regulations
6. Must not be under a current Suspension of Favorable Personnel Actions (FLAGS)

PREFERRED POSITION QUALIFICATIONS:

1. Knowledge of Joint Operations
2. Knowledge of Law Enforcement Support
3. Knowledge of Counterdrug Policies and Procedures
4. Knowledge and experience in all Counterdrug operations
5. Knowledge of NGR 500-2/ANGI 10-801
6. Knowledge of Departments of the Army and Air Force organizations
7. Security Clearance of SECRET
8. Able to spend long periods away from friends/family to include weekends and holidays.

OPERATOR' TRAINING COURSE REQUIREMENTS:

1. Must be able to run 5 miles
2. Must be able to complete 12 mile ruck march
3. Able to work in an austere environment for up to 30 days at a time
4. Able to climb towers and other structures in excess of 300 ft. without extreme fear

SELECTIVE PLACEMENT FACTORS:

1. Must have minimum 3 year retainability with TMD traditional/M-Day unit of assignment
2. Must be qualified for initial entry into or continued service in the Joint Task Force Counterdrug Program IAW NGR 500-2/ANGI 10-801, to include: being deployable asset; have Unit Commander's recommendation for initial or continued service in the Counterdrug Program; not have any unfavorable actions of any kind; no record of moral turpitude or convictions of any kind; meet the medical standards IAW applicable Army or Air Force Regulations; and maintain physical fitness standards IAW applicable Army or Air Force Regulations
3. Urinalysis testing upon entry on active duty and periodic testing while on active duty.
4. SMs are required to attend IDT/UTA and AT while on Counterdrug orders
5. Status of Counterdrug funding changes from year to year
6. Must have current Periodic Health Assessment (PHA) with the last 12 months
7. Must have HIV test within 2 years of projected start date
8. Must not be on a temporary profile
9. Standards of Conduct:
 - a. Members are required to uphold the highest standards of conduct and personal appearance. Outside employment, association and off-duty conduct/activities must be consistent with federal directives on ethics and with state and federal conflict of interest policies
 - b. National Guard members participating in the Counterdrug Support Program are required to comply with state laws and with DOD 5500.7-R., they are required to uphold the highest standards of conduct and personal appearance
