MEMORANDUM FOR SEE DISTRIBUTION

SUBJECT: (JFTX P15-11) Assignment of Military Training Duties to Title 32 Military Technicians

1. References. See enclosure 1.
2. Applicability. This policy applies to all Title 32 Military Technicians.
3. Purpose. To provide guidance on what duties Title 32 Military Technicians may and may not perform in technician status.
4. Policy.
  - a. Title 32 Military Technicians, both dual status and non-dual status, may not:
    - (1) Attend military technical training schools in technician status. These schools are intended to train personnel in military occupational specialties and in some cases require mandatory physical training standards or other military training that is over and above the enhancement of technician job performance.
    - (2) Participate in medical mobility processing. Medical mobility processing or any other procedure requiring weigh-ins, urinalysis, or drug testing must be completed in an inactive duty or active duty military status. Drug testing connected to a ground or aircraft accident, or observation of erratic behavior, requires the technician be placed in a military status, either inactive duty or active duty.
    - (3) Be required to receive immunizations to maintain worldwide medical deployment requirements; however, Technicians may voluntarily receive influenza vaccine in accordance with OPM guidance referenced above and TN-11-24.
    - (4) Undergo an annual military physical fitness test while in technician status either voluntarily or involuntarily.
  - b. Title 32 Military Technicians, both dual status and non-dual status, may:
    - (1) Be authorized an excused absence of short duration to participate in voluntary Physical Fitness Programs (PFPs). Technicians are encouraged to participate in PFPs in accordance with 5 U.S.C. 7901.

SUBJECT: (JFTX P15-11) Assignment of Military Training Duties to Title 32 Military Technicians

(2) Be assigned to train in the wear and use of chemical warfare equipment while in technician status in accordance with the 5 U.S.C. 7106(a).

(3) Fire, qualify, and carry a weapon while in technician status when the duties of their technician position require such in accordance with DoDD 5210.56.

5. This memorandum will expire 2 years from the effective date of publication unless sooner rescinded or superseded.
