MEMORANDUM FOR SEE DISTRIBUTION

SUBJECT: (JFTX I14-17) FY15 Texas Military Employee Holiday Guidance

1. **Purpose.** The Adjutant General (TAG) is the leave authority for the Texas Military. This memorandum provides guidance to employees during holidays.
2. **References.** See enclosure 1a.
3. **Intent.** This guidance is intended to provide equitable and consistent application of rules governing holidays, "in lieu of" holidays, liberal leave, work schedule changes and administrative leave associated with holidays. For the purpose of pay and leave of employees, holidays are considered non-work days.

4. **Employee Guidance.**

a. Federal Employees. In accordance with federal law (5 U.S.C § 6103) the following is guidance for approved holidays. (AGR, ADOS, Military Technician)

(1) Monday holidays are observed on the holiday for employees regularly scheduled to work on that Monday, and on the preceding Friday for employees not regularly scheduled to work on that Monday.

(2) Weekend Holidays. Saturday holidays are observed on the last regularly scheduled duty day before the holiday. Sunday holidays are observed on the first regularly scheduled duty day after the holiday.

(3) TXARNG AGR and ADOS observe federal holidays IAW Para 4-25 & 26, AR 600-8-10. TXANG AGR observes federal holidays IAW Para 4-10, AFI 36-3003. Refer to AR 600-8-10 and AFI 36-3003 as applicable for chargeable leave rules for holiday absences.

(4) Federal Holidays. See enclosure 1b.

(5) Special FY 15 Holiday Schedule. All federal personnel are placed on a compressed work schedule, 4/10 M-Th, for the weeks of Thanksgiving, Christmas, and New Years in FY 15 (except for those select positions with an operational requirement designated by a component). This schedule change will maximize productivity during those weeks by having all employees work on Monday and will enable cost savings in utilities on the Friday after the holiday. This change effects the weeks of:

- November 24-28, 2014
- December 22-26, 2014
- December 29, 2014 to January 2, 2015

b. State Employees. Observe state-recognized Federal holidays IAW the Texas Government Code, Chapter 662. Provisions of this memorandum are subordinate to the provisions of the statute and the Texas Military Department's personnel policies. Generally, employees required to work on a holiday earn time off (compensatory time) to be taken at a later date.

(1) State employees are authorized to observe all Federal holidays *except* Columbus Day and holidays that fall on a Saturday or Sunday.

(2) In accordance with Texas Government Code, Chapter 662, Rosh Hashanah, Yom Kippur, Good Friday and Cesar Chavez Day are optional state holidays. A state employee is entitled to observe each optional holiday if the employee qualifies for the paid day off and agrees to give up during the same fiscal year an equivalent number of state holidays. However, an employee may not agree to give up the Friday after Thanksgiving Day, the day before or after Christmas Day or the recognized federal holidays in lieu of an optional state holiday.

(3) State Holidays. See enclosure 1c.

6. **Liberal Leave.** Liberal leave directs supervisors to allow most, if not all, personnel to take their personal leave and to curtail normal operations accordingly. Directors and supervisors make the operational determination as to the minimum staffing levels required, if any, when liberal leave is authorized.

7. **Additional Holidays.** If an executive order authorizes an additional holiday, the Human Resource Office will publish guidance. TXM employees are considered on-duty during agency supported holiday events such as TXM Holiday Party and Tree Lighting Ceremony.

8. Key personnel, including any designated for National Guard Civil Support response, will ensure their availability for recall by the Joint Operations Center. Components will align schedules to provide necessary support to deployment/demobilization activities and other mission requirements.

Federal Holidays. Detailed guidance for recognized state and federal holidays can be found in 5 USC § 6103 and TGC Chapter 622A. Federal public holidays that are observed by the Texas Military (along with any other days declared to be holidays by federal statute or executive order):

13 OCT 14	Columbus Day, the second Monday in October (except state employees)
11 NOV 14	Veteran's Day
27 NOV 14	Thanksgiving Day, the fourth Thursday in November
25 DEC 14	Christmas Day
01 JAN 15	New Year's Day
19 JAN 15	Birthday of Martin Luther King Jr., the third Monday in January
16 FEB 15	Washington's birthday (President's Day), the third Monday in February
25 MAY 15	Memorial Day, the last Monday in May
03 JUL 15	Independence Day Observed (except for state employees)
07 SEP 15	Labor Day, the first Monday in September
12 OCT 15	Columbus Day, the second Monday in October (except state employees)
11 NOV 15	Veteran's Day
26 NOV 15	Thanksgiving Day, the fourth Thursday in November
25 DEC 15	Christmas Day

State Holidays. State employees are authorized to observe the following state holidays (along with state-recognized federal holidays, with the exceptions noted in Enclosure 1b, IAW the Texas Government Code, Chapter 662, Subchapter A):

28 NOV 14	Day after Thanksgiving (all agencies closed)
24 DEC 14	Christmas Eve Day (all agencies closed)
26 DEC 14	Day after Christmas (all agencies closed)
02 MAR 15	Texas Independence Day (skeleton crew required)
21 APR 15	San Jacinto Day (skeleton crew required)
19 JUN 15	Emancipation Day (skeleton crew required)
27 AUG 15	LBJ's Birthday (skeleton crew required)
