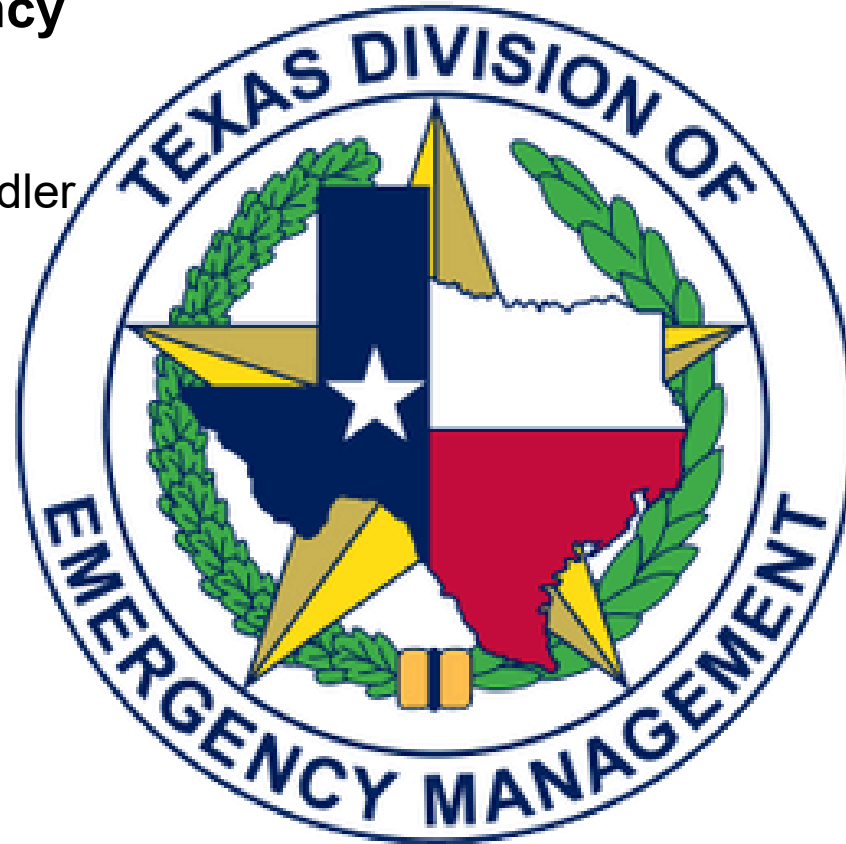

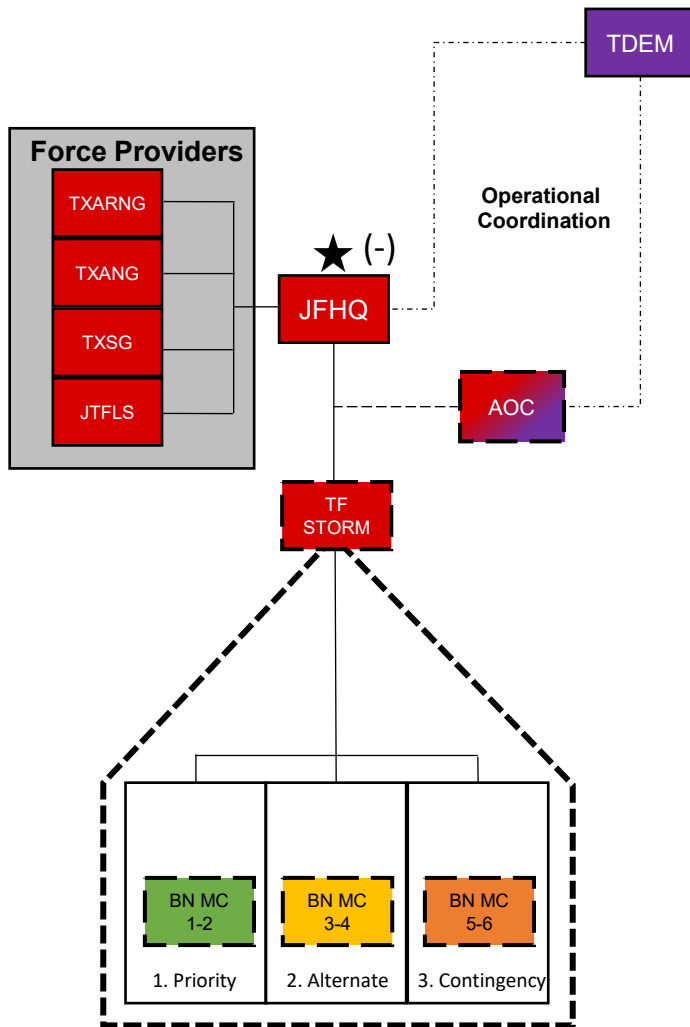

5. Discuss potential CBRN units response to HAZMAT incident.



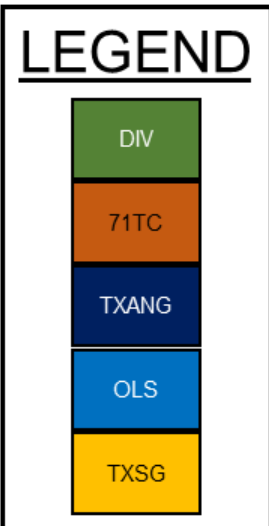
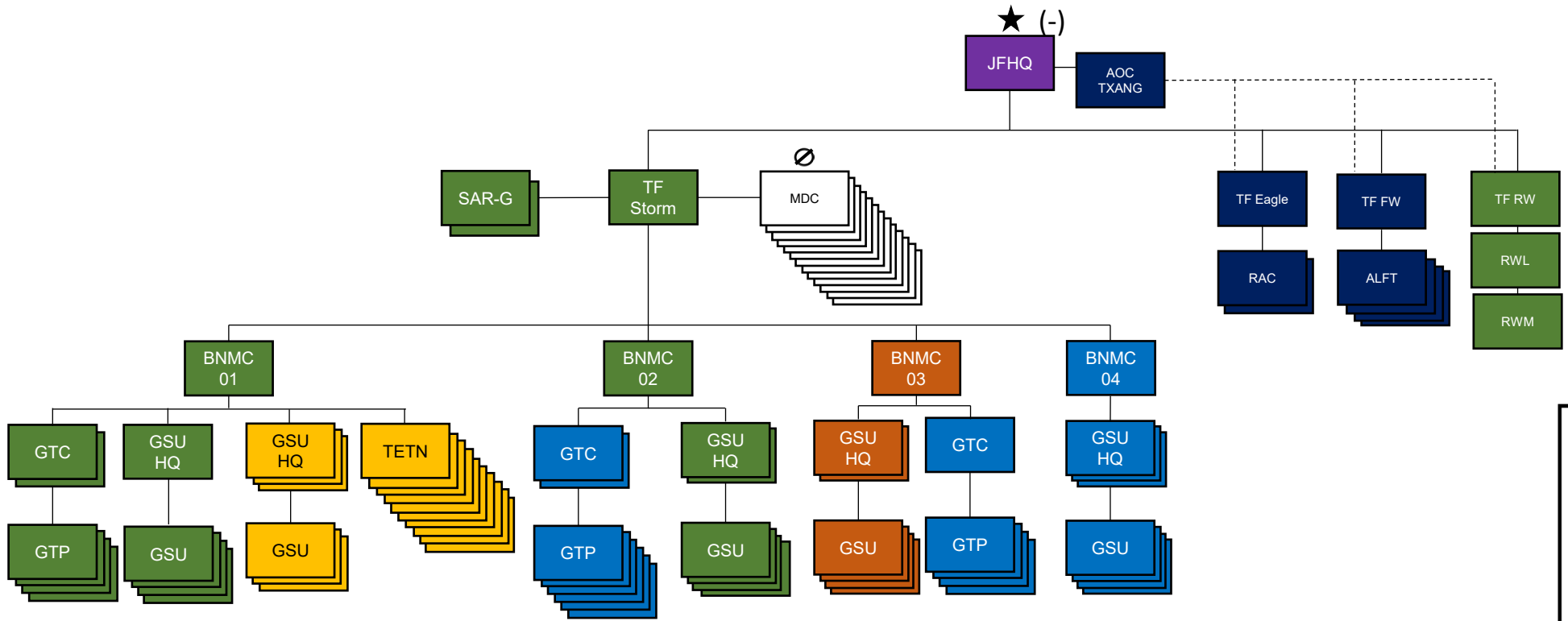

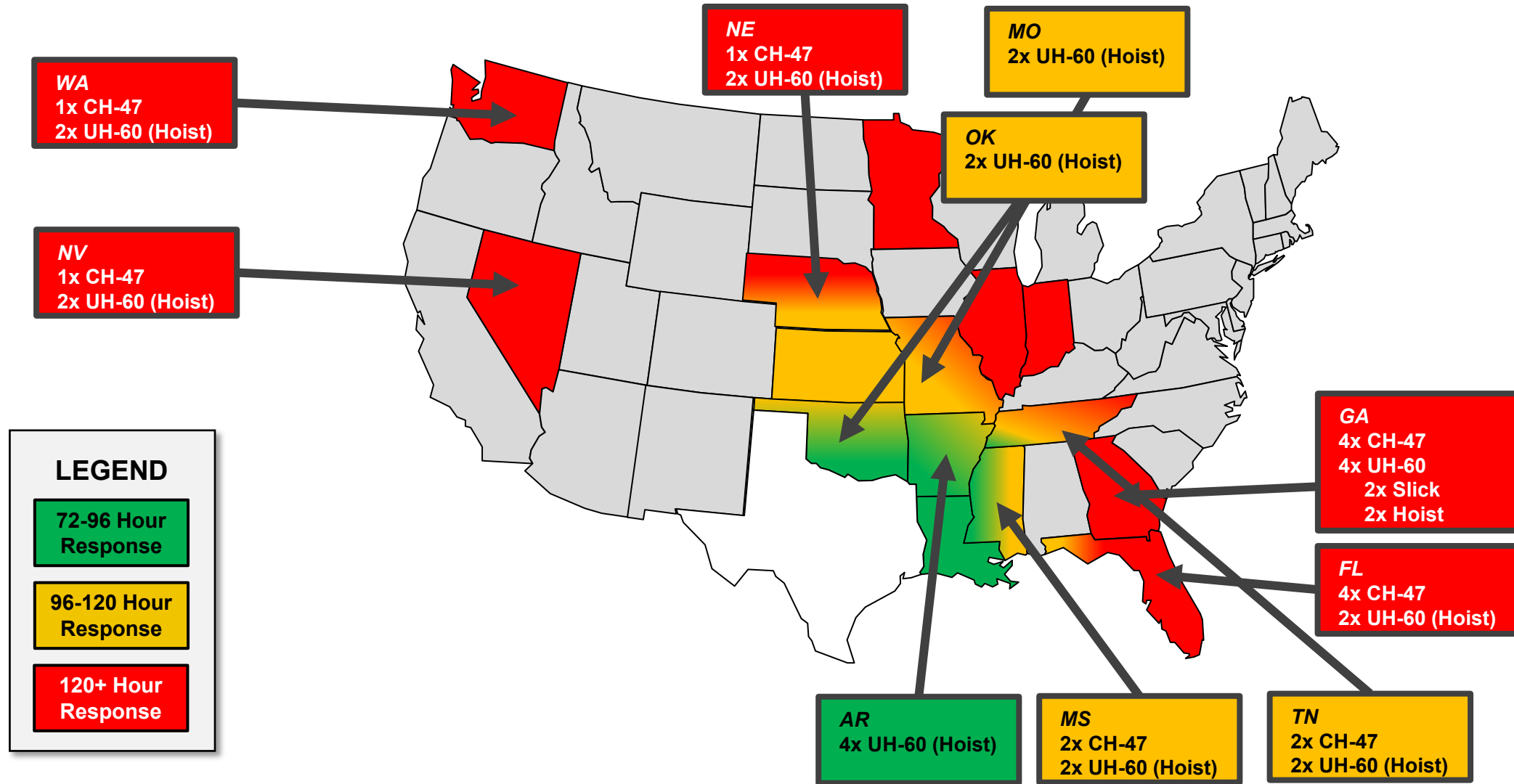

# TMD

## Missions (March 2022- Present)

**DSCA:** Over the last 12 months, Texas Guardsmen responded to the impacts of multiple hazardous civilian events and weather conditions. Boosting the response from the Texas Department of Emergency Management. Since March 2022, wildfires throughout Texas led to Governor Greg Abbott declaring a state of emergency and activating the Texas Military Department to provide additional civil support for multiple wildfire responses. These efforts helped protect property and human lives through suppression efforts TMD also responded to and staged to support Civil Disturbance events, most notably those related to the reversal of Roe v. Wade. Texas also utilized TMD Guardsmen in the continued battle against COVID with the State of Texas Mobile Testing Team (MTT) Program, which provides both testing and vaccinations within the Austin area. This team has continued COVID Support for the State of Texas where needed most. **Operation Lone Star (OLS)** has deterred transnational criminal networks along the Texas-Mexico border. Texas Guardsmen continue to construct a temporary barrier to help protect Texas citizens from criminal networks trespassing onto their private property.

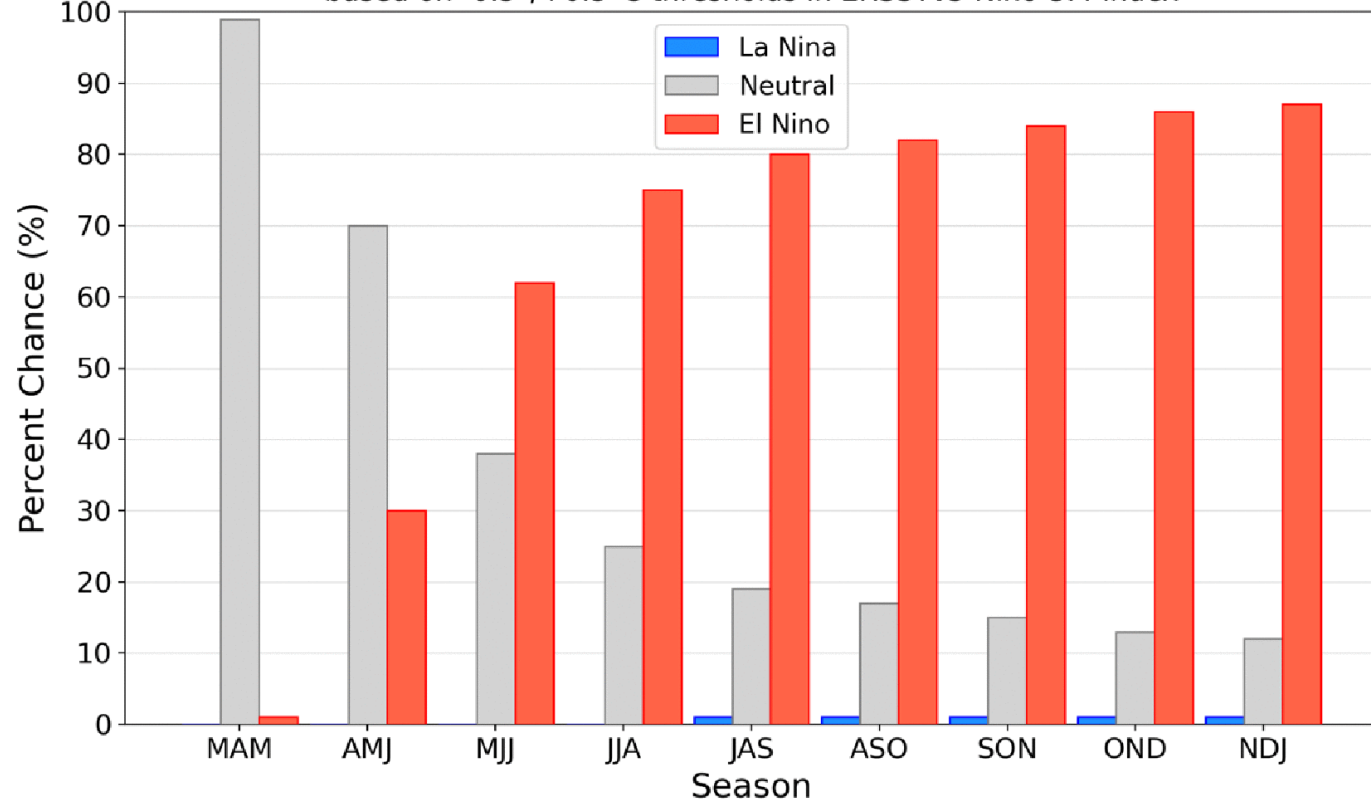
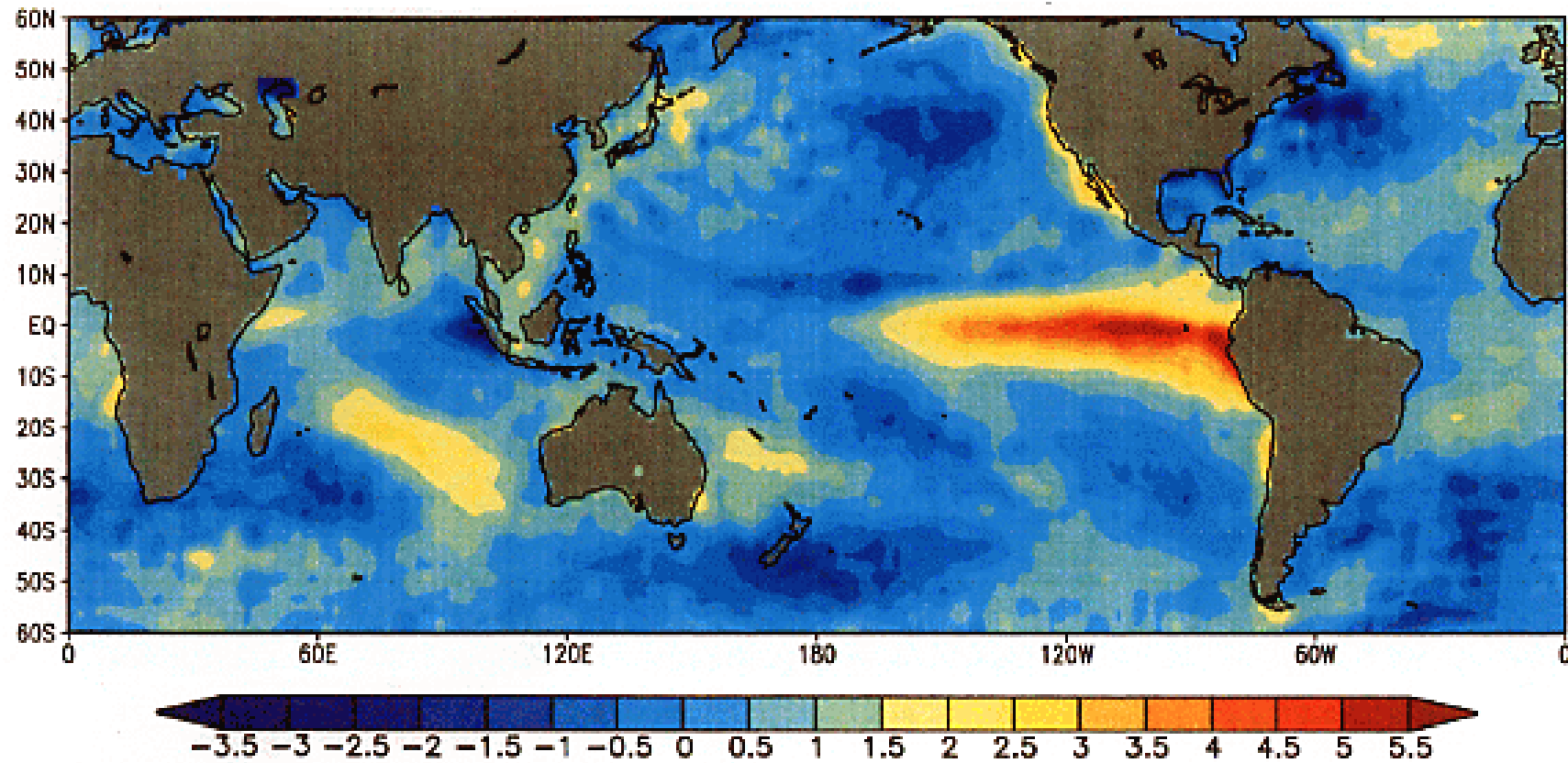


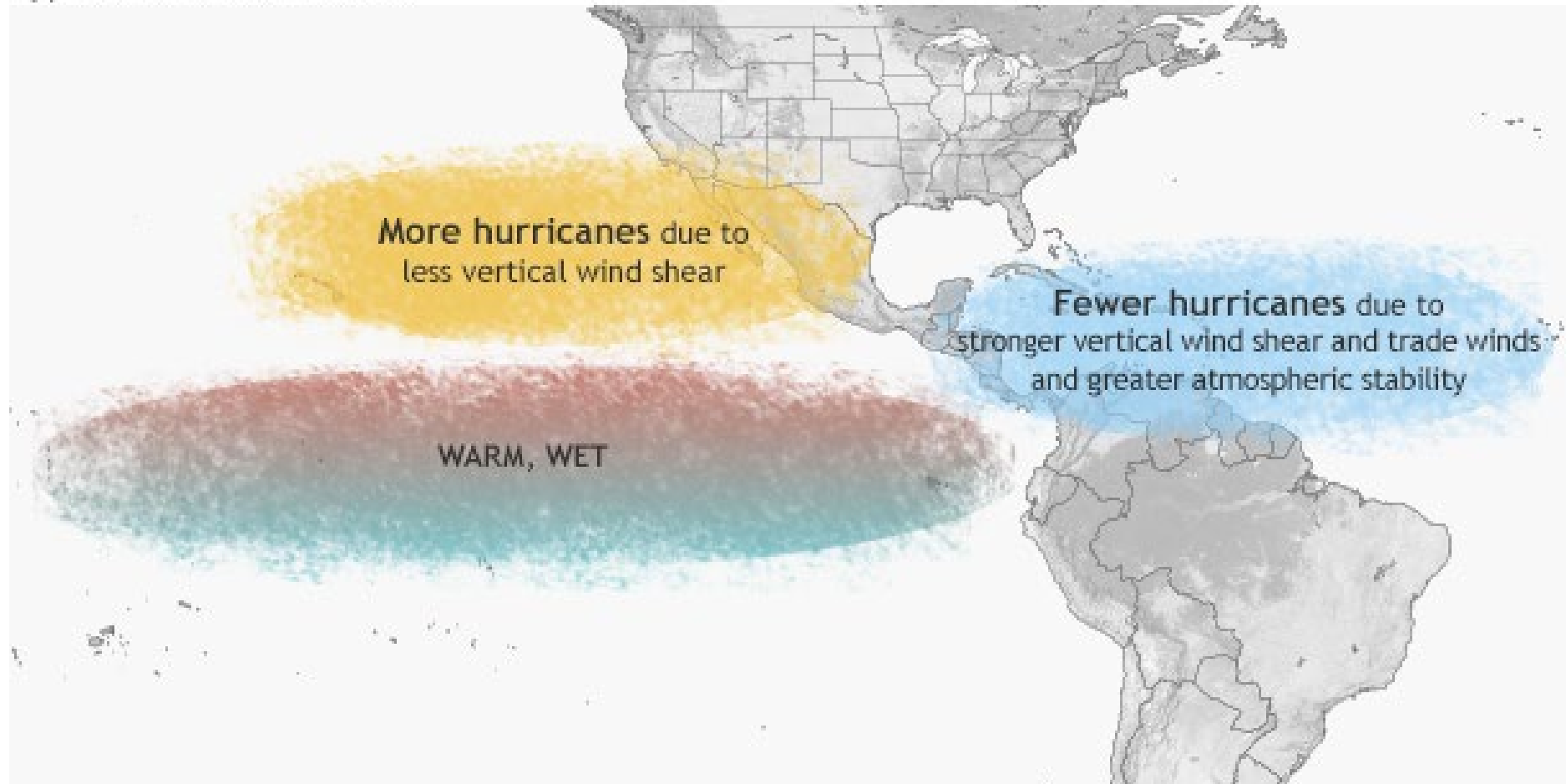
Figure 7. Official ENSO probabilities for the Niño 3.4 sea surface temperature index ( $5^{\circ}\text{N}$ - $5^{\circ}\text{S}$ ,  $120^{\circ}\text{W}$ - $170^{\circ}\text{W}$ ). Figure updated 13 April 2023.

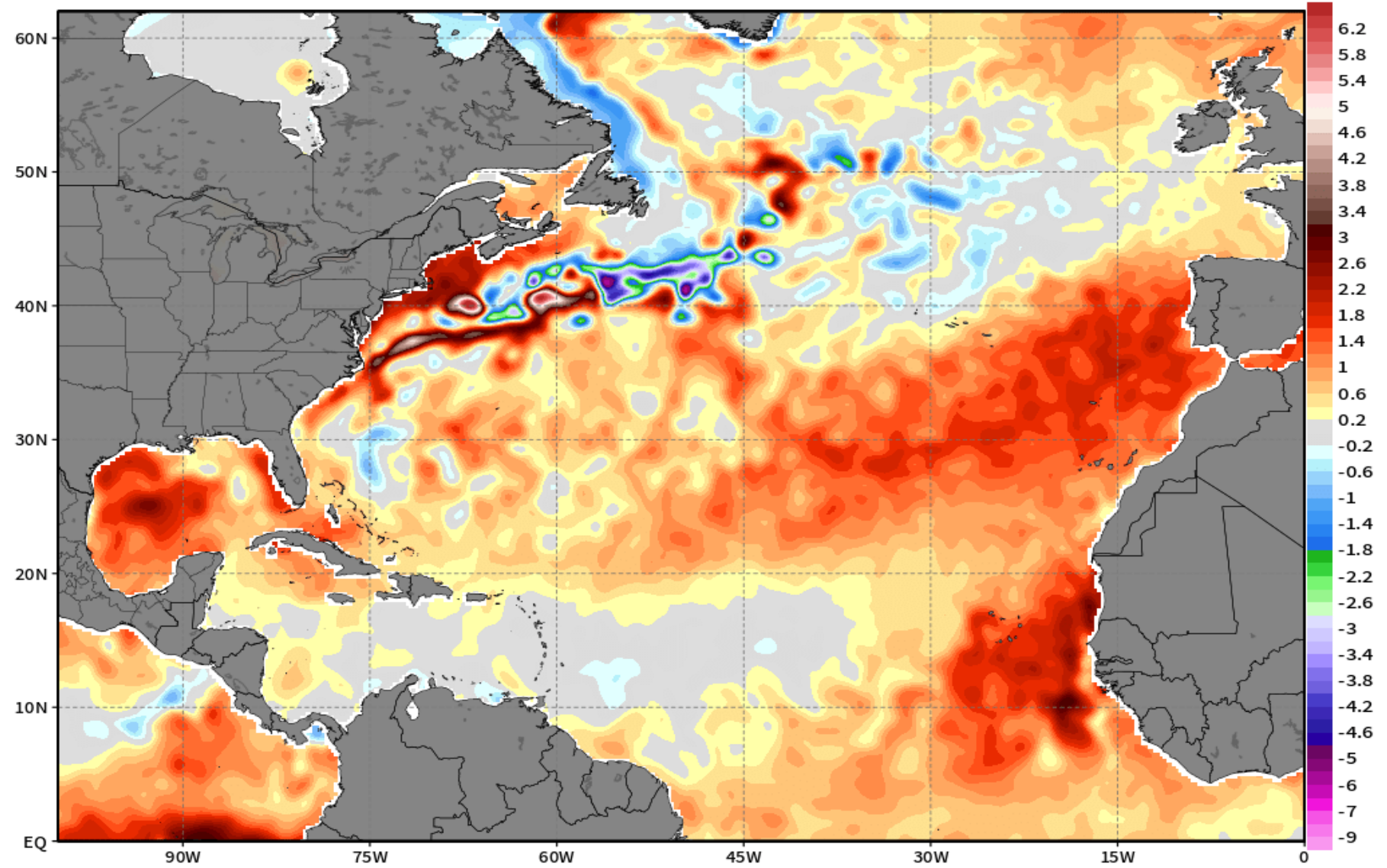

# Scenario: Hurricane Bernice

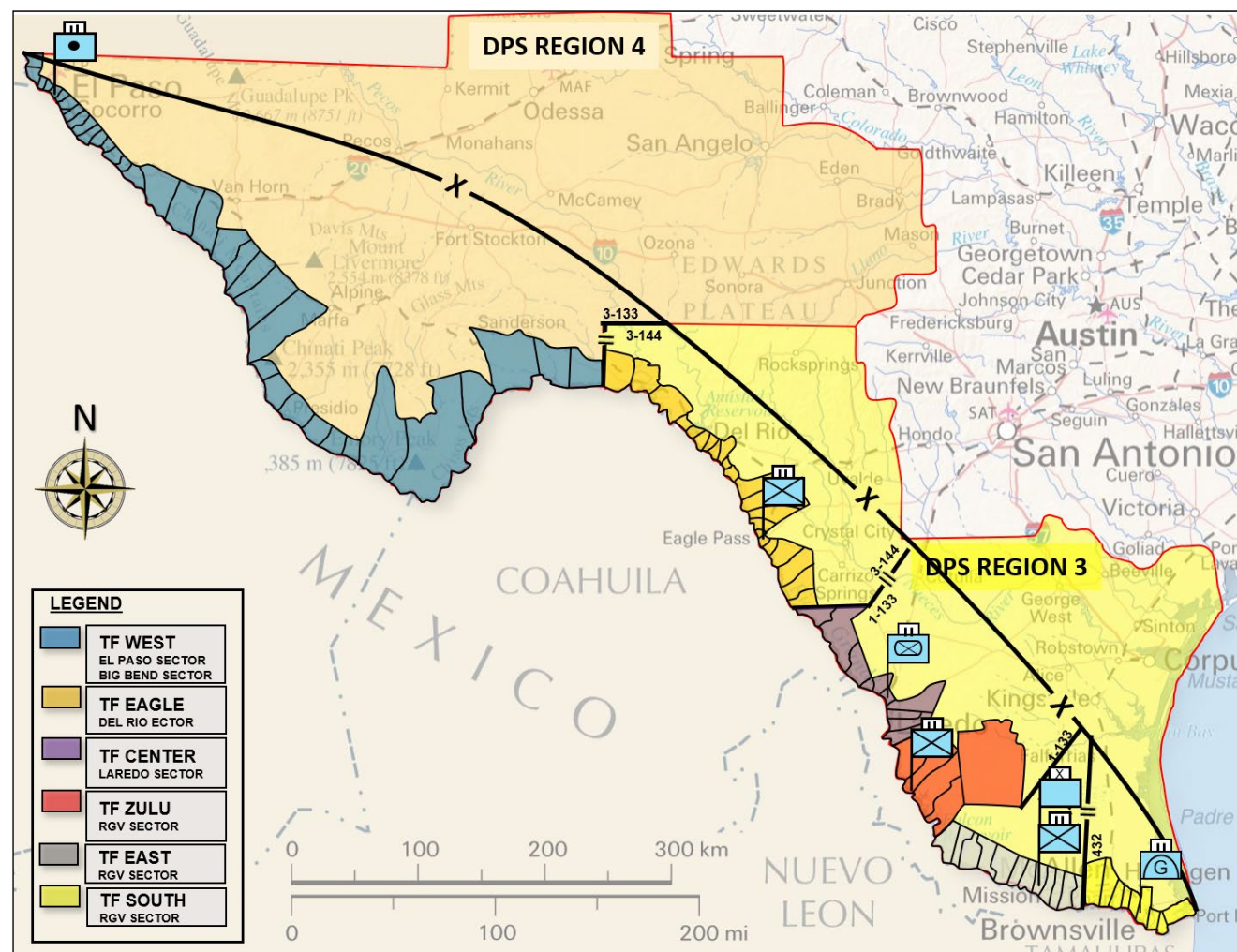
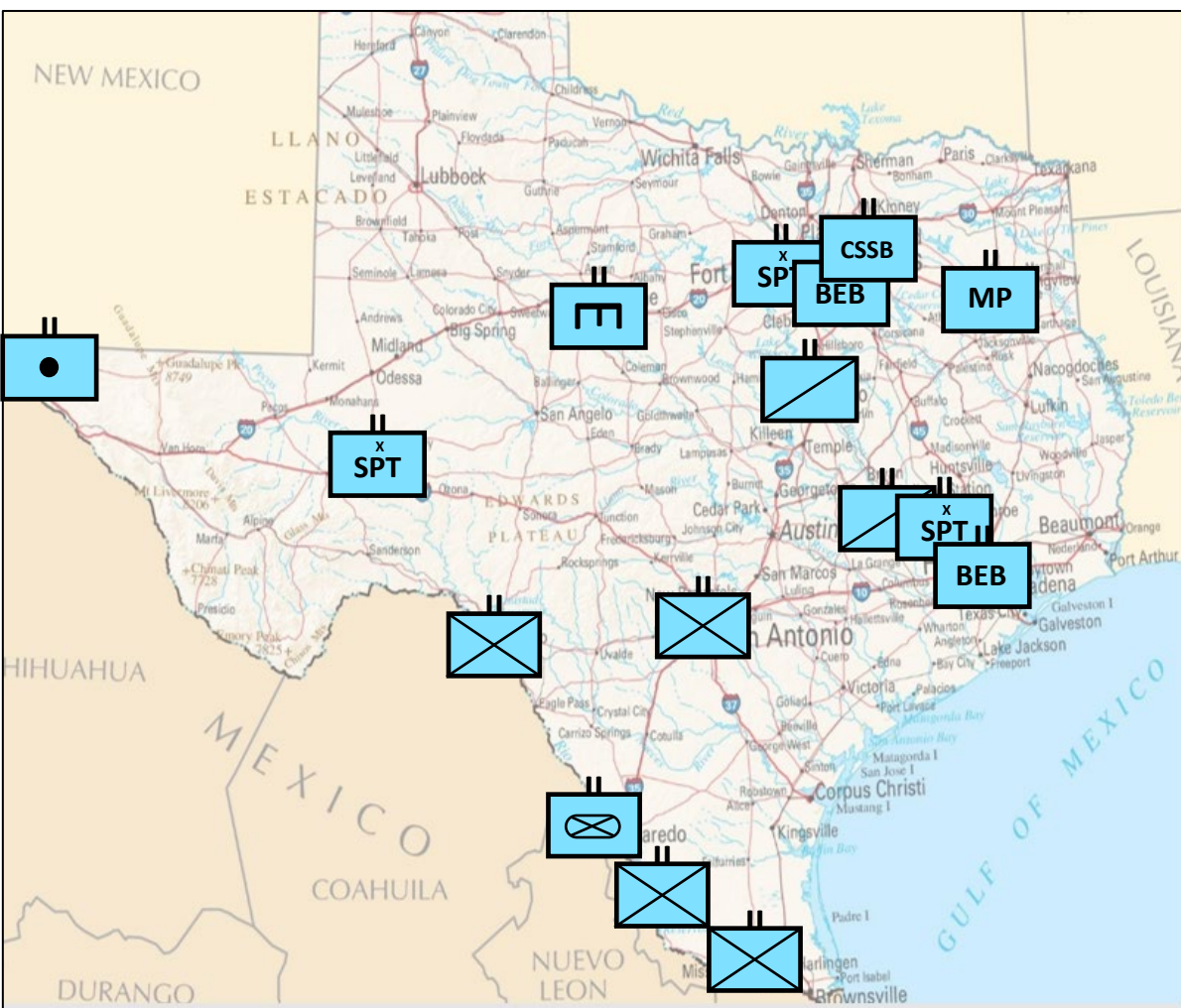
- Due to a moderately strong El Nino Effect, Texas experienced an unusually mild winter, and a summer like weather pattern began in early March. Hurricane season began unusually early as Hurricane Aaron struck Miami, FL on 18 February 23.
- Bernice began to develop off the west coast of Africa on June 7 and low-pressure center formed early on 11 June, but easterly shear initially prevented any organization of the associated convection.
- Bernice moved rapidly to the west and west-northwest for the next couple of days, staying convectively active while they moved over Cuba on 20 June.

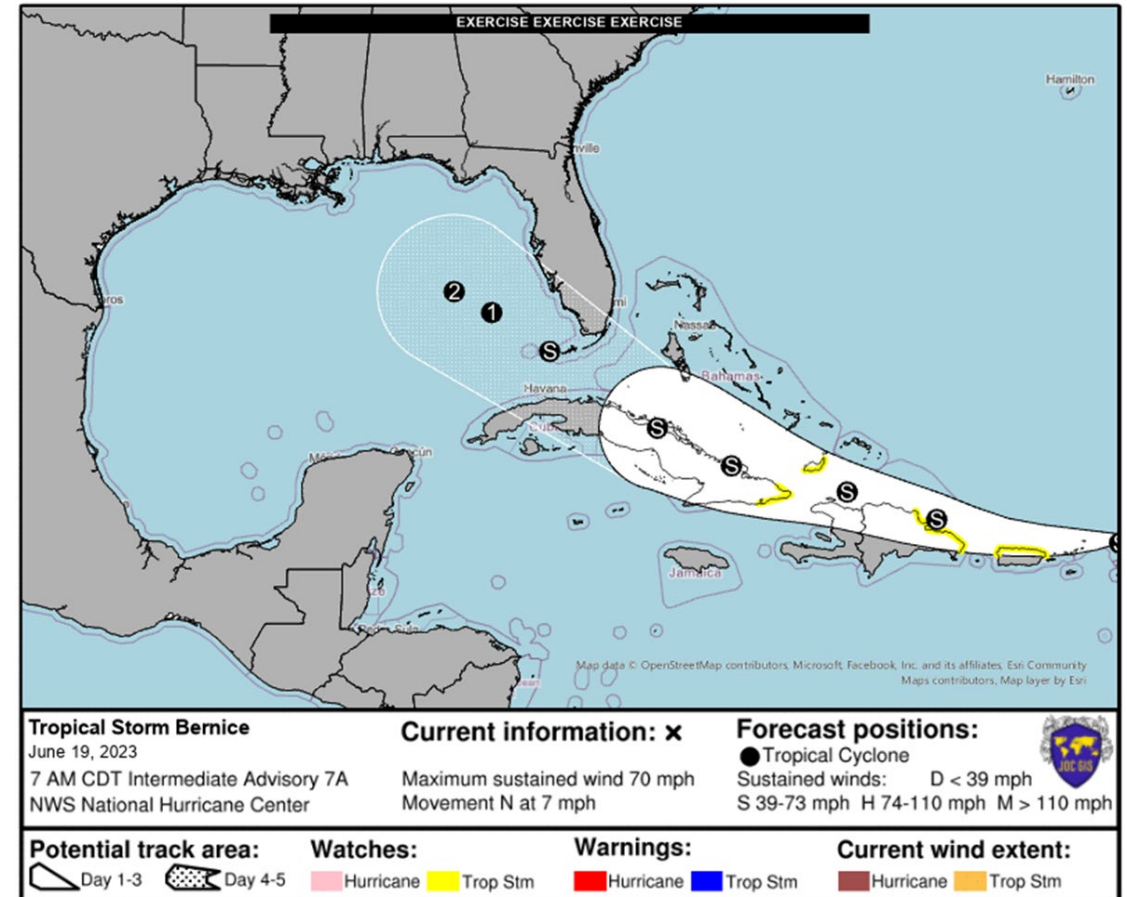
- During a notice incident, there may be an elevated threat that allows for further coordination and planning.

# INJECT #1 – BORDER RESPONSE (Pre-Landfall)

Since June 3, 2023, Texas & TMD had been monitoring a large migrant caravan (3,000 personnel) progress up through Central America (June 7, 2023, Hurricane Bernice begins to develop off the coast of Africa). These individuals are aggressively attempting to reach the U.S. prior to the warmer months and the extreme temperatures. Small groups (10-15 pax) begin to arrive at the border on 24 June 23 and larger groups (75-150 pax) or the main body of the caravan is anticipated to arrive in the next 24-48 hrs. It is a coincidence the caravan has reached the border while Hurricane Bernice is set to make landfall in SE Texas. While attention and resources are applied to respond to Bernice, migrants may see this as a ‘target of opportunity to cross the border as they are monitoring social media for Texas weather updates and discussion.

# INJECT #2 – EXTENSIVE FLOODING (Post-Landfall)

On 25 and 26 June 2023, torrential rainfall along with a tremendous storm surge has caused both Addicks and Barker Reservoirs to overflow their banks. This has pushed thousands of cubic feet of water into the neighborhoods North and West of the reservoirs, flooding thousands of homes with up to five feet of water. TDEM after being notified of Hurricane Bernice begins requesting resources requiring a staging area, buses, air assets, and sheltering ops from the TMD.

TX-TF1 and local authorities are responding to search and extraction for citizens in flooded areas. TDEM was notified that the storm surge has displaced hazardous storage containers and requests to activate the Civil Support Team (CST) to assess the condition of the storage tanks. They request components of Homeland Response Force (HRF) -TX be on standby should the CST assessment find a HAZMAT event. The local authority's highest priority is life, safety and resident rescue.

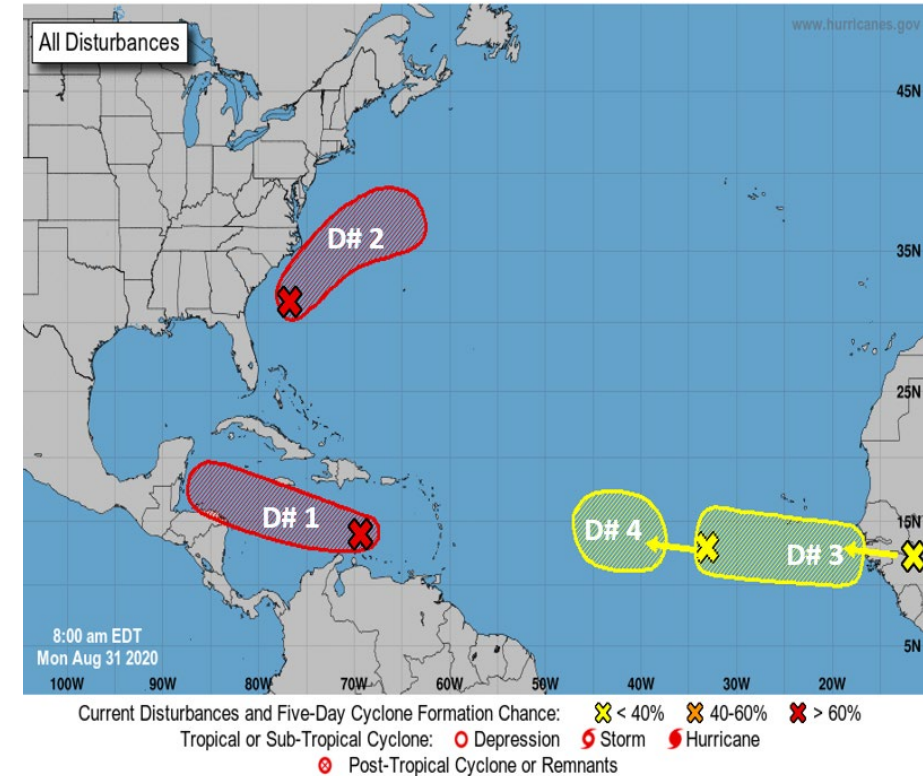

# Phase 3: Recovery and Transition

## Overview: (R-day to UTC)

- Phase begins when the life-saving and life-sustaining activities for the affected population have been stabilized to the point where local, state, and federal resources are sufficient to continue without TMD response tasks and ends upon determination by civil authorities that recovery tasks have been completed.
- TMD does not generally support recovery tasks; however, in certain instances, it is possible TMD could be tasked to support specific aspects of the recovery.
- Transition begins when all operational aspects of mission assignments are complete and redeployment of remaining TMD forces commences.
- Phase ends when all response forces have been relieved and redeployed, C2 is transferred to their respective commands, and TMD forces have transitioned all operations back to civil authorities.

# Phase 3: Recovery and Transition

## J1: (R-day to UTC)

- Conduct final PEMS accountability validation and final payroll close.
- Confirm personnel addresses for paycheck dissemination if no direct deposit was completed.
- Finalize award guidance, validate award eligibility, and issue awards.
- Support units with reverse JRSOI as needed.
- Ensure all SMs received a copy of their SAD orders and employer letter.
- Close submission of worker's compensation claim packets.
- Report final accountability to J3, J4, J8 and OSA.
- Distribute hard pay checks (Warrants) through BDE S1s via TL.
- Conduct AAR & close JPOC operations.

### RECOVERY

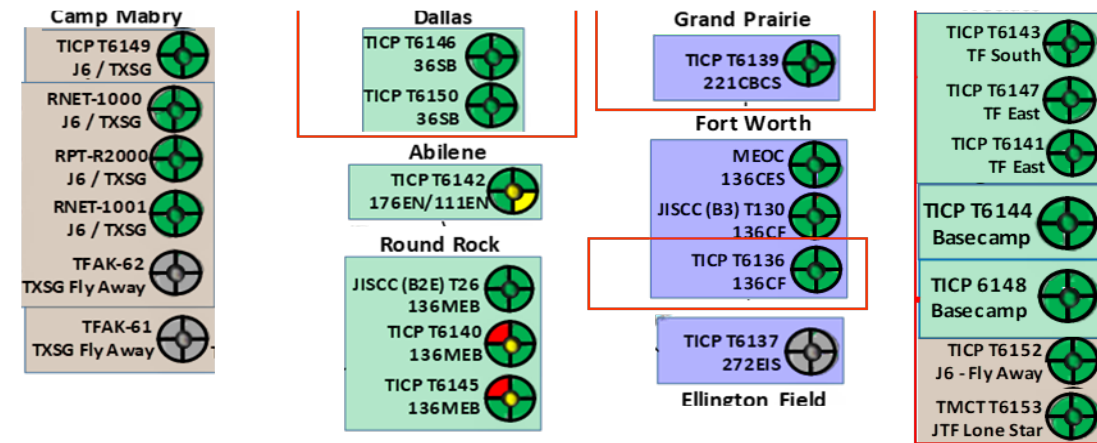
### RECOVERY

### TRANSITION

- Inventory/PMCS complete shortage annexes.
- Direct communication assets to leave the JOA in a manner that has the least mission impact and is IAW leadership guidance.
- Refit upon arrival to Home Station and correct any remaining deficiencies.

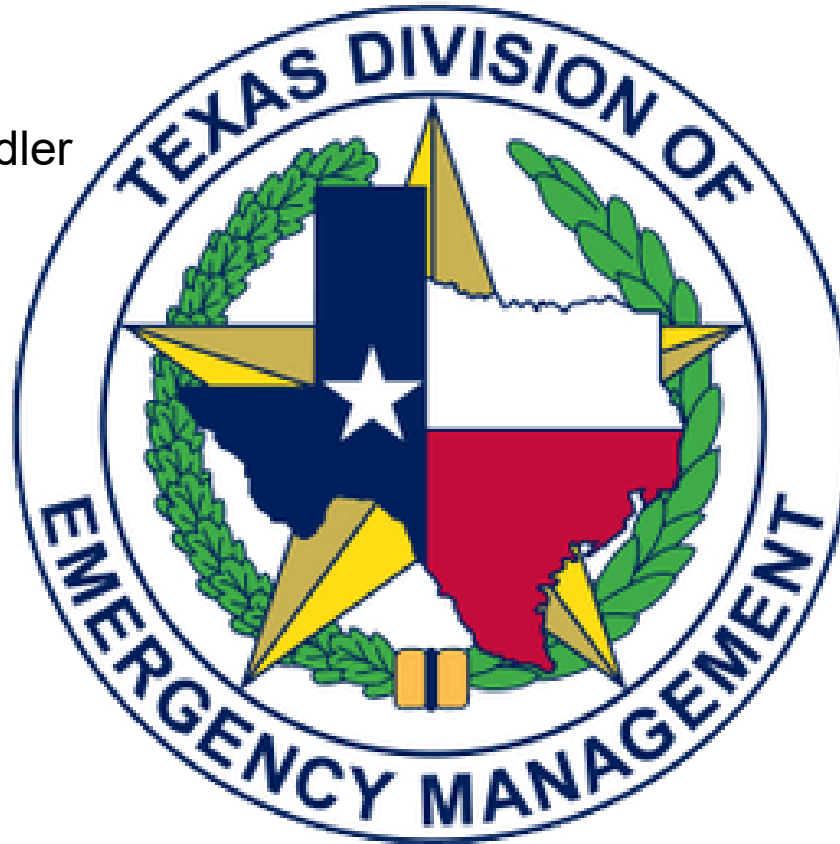
