MEMORANDUM FOR Army National Guard Military Personnel Officers (MILPOs) of all States, the U.S. Virgin Islands, Guam, and the District of Columbia

SUBJECT: Army National Guard (ARNG) Medical Waiver Requirements for Army Reserve Officer Training Corps (ROTC) Cadets (PPOM 22-048)

1. References:

a. Department of Defense Instruction (DoDI) 6130.03, Volume 1 (Medical Standards for Military Service: Appointment, Enlistment, or Induction).

b. United States Army Cadet Command (USACC), ATCC-RO memorandum (Simultaneous membership Program (SMP)) "Fast Track" Program and Procedures, 11 April 2019.

c. Army Regulation (AR) 40-501 (Standards of Medical Fitness).

d. National Guard Regulation (NGR) 600-100, (Commissioned Officers Federal Recognition and Personnel Actions).

e. Army National Guard, ARNG-ZA memorandum (Delegation of Authority for Medical Accession Waivers), 22 September 2020.

2. Purpose: This policy further clarifies accession waiver requirements for those commissioning through ROTC and supplements the recently published 22 November 2022 NGR 600-100.

3. Limitations: Prior to the NGR 600-100 update released in 2021 the publication was dated 1994. It was unclear which ROTC physicals required review by ARNG. The 2021 version of NGR 600-100 stated "send ROTC DODMERB, and LDAC exams to ARNG Office of the Chief Surgeon (ARNG-CSG) for final approval and to acquire a proper 'Physical capacity/stamina, Upper extremities, Lower extremities, Hearing/ear, Eyes, Psychiatric (PULHES)' factor, for initial appointment IAW AR 40-501, chapter 8-

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14a(1) and (2)." However, ARNG did not see an increase in ROTC medical waiver submissions and observed continued inconsistencies from the 54 states and territories.

4. Policy:

a. Personnel trying to contract into Army ROTC must complete a Department of Defense Medical Examination Review Board (DoDMERB) accession physical IAW reference a. or have a Military Entrance Processing Station physical fast-tracked and approved by DoDMERB. See reference b.

b. Personnel who fail to meet standards outlined in reference a. require a medical waiver. IAW reference c., the Commanding General (CG), USACC is the medical waiver authority for entry into Army ROTC. See enclosure 1 for an example of an approved ROTC Waiver on a DoDMERB physical.

c. Once contracted, if a new medical condition occurs that does not meet the standards in reference a. a medical determination is required. Medical determinations are medical waivers. The CG, USACC is the medical waiver authority for continuation in ROTC and these medical determinations. See enclosure 2 for an example of ROTC Medical Determination.

d. Approved Cadet Command medical waivers and medical determinations allow applicants to medically qualify to enter ROTC, Cadets to continue in the program, and to commission into the United States Army Reserves.

e. IAW reference c. the Director, ARNG is the medical waiver authority for all accessions for the ARNG and the Army National Guard of the United States (ARNGUS).

f. Cadets who access into the ARNG/ARNGUS AND required a Cadet Command medical waiver or medical determination must obtain a ARNG medical waiver PRIOR to commissioning and signing their Oaths of Office (DA 71 and NGB Form 337). ARNG-CSG

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g. Officer Strength Managers should submit medical waiver packets in Medical Action Tracking System (MATS), a module within MEDCHART, as soon as possible. See NGR 600-100, 2.h.(4) for a list of the required documents. See Enclosure 3 for MATS Access Policy.

h. Failure to have an approved ARNG medical waiver prior to commissioning will result in delayed processing by the Federal Recognition Board.

MATS Access Policy

1.1 System Access

- a. Users request MATS access at <u>https://medchart.ngb.army.mil/MED-</u> <u>CHART/default.aspx</u>
- b. Requestors complete:
 - (1) <u>MATS Training One Time for LNO Users Ongoing Availability Tickets,</u> <u>Multiple Dates | Eventbrite</u>
 - (a) Training is offered monthly.
 - (b) It is recommended to register and attend training on your personal device as Eventbrite is not user friendly on government networks.
 - (c) If unable to successfully register, email <u>RCTraining@asmr.com</u> for assistance in getting access to the next available class.
 - (d) ASM Research (ASMR) verifies training completion by sending attendees an email.
 - (2) Health Insurance Portability and Accountability Act (HIPAA) training (annual requirement) by one of the following:
 - (a) Complete through MEDCHART (no training certificate is issued)
 - (b) Complete through Joint Knowledge Online (JKO) and upload the certificate into MEDCHART
 - 1. <u>https://jkodirect.jten.mil/Atlas2/page/desktop/DesktopHome.j</u> <u>sf</u>
 - 2. Course title: HIPAA and Privacy Act Training (1.5 hrs)
 - 3. Course ID is DHA-US001
- c. Once the above requirements are complete forward the ASMR training completion email to <u>ng.ncr.ngb-arng.list.hrr-rob-waivers-mil@army.mil</u> so the request can be reviewed and approved.
- 1.2 Authorized Users
 - a. Appropriate Users (positions are not all inclusive):
 - (1) The following positions, confirmed by the Strength Maintenance (HRR) Medical Waivers Team, may need MATS Liaison (LNO) access to process medical waivers:
 - (a) Medical Entrance Procession Station (MEPS) Guidance Counselors
 - (b) R&R Sergeant Major (SGM) or Senior (SR) OPS Noncommissioned Officer in Charge (NCOIC)
 - (c) Officer Strength Managers (OSM)
 - 1. Basic Branch Recruiters and/or their Staff

- 2. Specialty Branch Recruiters (AMEDD, Chaplain, JAG) and/or staff
- 3. Warrant Officer Strength Managers and/or staff
- (2) The following positions, confirmed by the Chief Surgeon's Office (CSG), may need access to MATS to process Convalescence Leave:
 - (a) State Surgeon (SS)
 - (b) Deputy State Surgeon (DSS)
 - (c) Medical Readiness NCO
 - (d) Health Service Support / Medical Actions
 - (e) Nurse Case Manager
 - (f) Full Time provider at state level
 - (g) Deputy G1
 - (h) Supervisor for DSS
 - ** These positions should NOT be submitting medical waivers.**
- (3) Exceptions to this policy will require a memorandum signed by the Recruiting and Retention Commander or the SS stating the position and roles required (Medical Waivers / Convalescence Leave).
- 1.3 Approval Authority
 - a. The final authority for granting MATS LNO access is:
 - (1) HRR Medical Waivers Team for accession medical waivers.
 - (a) HRR Medical Waivers Team has the authority to remove access and/or require retraining. Retraining may include reviewing slide presentations, on-site training, or teleconferences.
 - (2) CSG for processing convalescent leave.
 - (3) If additional MATS LNO roles or permissions are required, the MATS LNO must contact the HRR Medical Waivers with justification.
 - b. After 90 days of not accessing the system, the MATS LNO's account will become inactive.
