



OFFICER CANDIDATE SCHOOL TRAINING OPTIONS

FEDERAL OCS

Where: Fort Moore, GA Length: 12 Weeks

When: Offered year-around

Who:

- 1. Non-Prior Service
- 2. Prior Service Navy
- 3. Prior Service Air Force

Age: 18–33 (Must completed FOCS before 34th Birthday)

Education: Bachelor's Degree



TRADITIONAL STATE

Where: Camp Swift, TX Length: 12 months

When: One Weekend / Month

- Phase 0: APR MAY
- Phase I: JUNE 2 Weeks
- Phase II: JUL FEB
- Phase III: MAR 2 Weeks
- Graduation: APRIL (Tentative)

Who:

- 1. Non-Prior Service (09S)
- 2. Prior Service

Age: 18-42 (Must commission before 42nd Birthday)

Education: 90 hrs towards a Bachelor's Degree

ACCELERATED

Where: Ft. McClellan, AL / Ft. Meade, SD Length: 8 Weeks

When: Summer (AOCS)

- State Phase 0: APR MAY
- PH I/II/III: JUN-JUL
- Graduation: AUGUST

Winter (AOCS)

- PH Ì/II/III: ĴAN-MAR
- Graduation: MARCH

Who:

- 1. Non-Prior Service
- 2. Prior-Service

Age: 18-42 (Must commission before 42nd Birthday)

Education: 90 hrs towards a Bachelor's Degree

*Not guaranteed. Priority for age



OFFICER CANDIDATE SCHOOL TRAINING PATH

BASIC COMBAT TRAINING (BCT)

- 10 Weeks
- Fort Benning / Fort Jackson / Fort Sill / Fort Leonard Wood

OFFICER CANDIDATE SCHOOL (OCS)

FOCS: 12 Weeks

SOCS: 12 Months (Typically April thru March)

AOCS: 8 Weeks (Same pre-requirements as SOCS, January thru March OR June thru July)

BASIC OFFICER LEADERS COURSE (BOLC)

- Length / Location of course dependent on Branch/Area of Concentration (AOC); 3 months to 9 months
- Scheduled by gaining TXARNG unit after the completion of OCS

OFFICER CANDIDATE SCHOOL BRANCHING

Branching / Area of Concentration is managed by the TXARNG Officer Personnel Management (OPM) Team:

- Officers are evaluated for branch assignment based on:
 - Officer Candidate's Branch Preferences
 - Branch Density / Officer Assignment Strength
 - Officer Candidates Home of Record
 - Officer Candidates Background (Major, Civilian Career, GPA)
 - Special Skills or Experience





OFFICER CANDIDATE SCHOOL QUALIFICATIONS

Federal OCS Qualifications:

- Age: Between 18 and 33 years old
- U.S. Citizen (Born or Naturalized)
- A college graduate with at lease a four-year degree
- Eligible for a Secret Security Clearance (Interim)
- General Technical Score of 110 on the Armed Services Aptitude Battery exam
- Chapter 2 Commissioning Physical
- Occupational Physical Assessment Test

State OCS / Accelerated OCS Qualifications:

- Age: Between 18 and 42 years old
- U.S. Citizen (Born or Naturalized)
- 90 College Semester Hours towards a 4 Year Degree and approved degree plan
- Eligible for a Secret Security Clearance (Interim)
- General Technical Score of 110 on the Armed Services Aptitude Battery exam
- Chapter 2 Commissioning Physical
- Occupational Physical Assessment Test
