## Texas Army National Guard to conduct final roll call ceremony for honorary member Spc. Rowan Windham

AUSTIN, Texas (Jan. 19, 2017) – The Texas Army National Guard will conduct a final roll call ceremony for 10-year-old honorary Guardsman, Spc. Rowan Windham, at Camp Mabry, in Austin, Texas, Jan. 24, 2017 at 10:15 a.m.

Windham, of New Braunfels, passed away on Dec. 15, 2016, from complications related to stem cell transplant procedures due to his rare disorder, Shwachmann-Diamond Syndrome. The disorder affects the pancreas, gastro-intestinal tract, immune system, blood and bone marrow. Throughout his life, he spent over 1,500 days in the hospital, received dozens of blood transfusions and made nearly 100 trips to the operating room.

After telling his nurse at the Children's Hospital in San Antonio, Sgt. David Hixson, who also serves in the Texas Army National Guard, that he "always wanted to be in the Army," the Texas National Guard made that dream a reality.

On Mar. 27, 2015, at Camp Mabry, Windham became a private first class and enlisted as an honorary member of the 124th Cavalry Regiment, 56th Infantry Brigade Combat Team, 36th Infantry Division and the 149th Attack Reconnaissance Battalion, 36th Combat Aviation Brigade, 36th Infantry Division. Windham was posthumously promoted to the rank of specialist earlier this month.

A final roll call ceremony is a military ritual designed to serve as a tribute paid by soldiers to their deceased comrade. It has its origin in the accountability roll call conducted by the unit first sergeant following combat called with the principle held by soldiers that all unit members will be accounted for, and none will ever be forgotten.

He is survived by his parents, Brian and Carrie Windham; his older brother, Ian; his older sister, Zoe; as well as many extended family members and close friends.
